Aims & Outcomes in PE

'Physical Literacy can be described as the motivation, confidence, physical competence and the knowledge and understanding that provides children with the foundation for lifelong participation in physical activity'

- Provide children with up to date resources and sporting equipment.
- Demonstrate an understanding of the importance of health and the role of physical activity on being a healthy individual.
- Develop and teach physical literacy through the PE curriculum, extra-curricular school sport and competitive school sport.
- A range of sports aimed at competitive, challenging and differentiated environments that allow children to improve their skills.

All children in classes have had an equal opportunity to access sport on a weekly basis. Each unit of work the children participate in is aimed at improving the children's fundamental movement skills (FMS) from reception all the way through to Year 6 in preparation for secondary school.

Brackenbury Primary School will measure PA (Physical Activity) against 5 main indicators, these include-

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport

These include Football, Basketball, Tag Rugby, Netball, the aims and outcomes are to provide children with the skills in PE, to then further represent the school.
